School refusal describes the disorder of a child who refuses to go to school on a regular basis or has problems staying in school. Symptoms. Children with school refusal may complain of physical symptoms shortly before it is time to leave for school or repeatedly ask to visit the school nurse.

Absence or extreme reluctance to attend school or class is the major defining criteria in school refusal. The onset can be gradual, or sudden, and occurs in approximately 2%-5% of school-age children. 1,3 The following may also be seen in children with school refusal: High rates of physical complaints (stomach aches, headaches).

### Children Refusing To Go To School Problem

School refusal is when a child gets extremely upset at the idea of going to school, or often misses some or all of the school day, and this distress doesn't go away. School refusal can mean that children have trouble going to school or trouble leaving home - they might not go to school at all.

School refusal is a sign of broader anxiety — separation anxiety, social anxiety, or general anxiety. Sometimes kids with school refusal complain of physical symptoms like stomachaches or headaches, but not all kids who refuse school have physical complaints.

School refusal is a child-motivated refusal to attend school or difficulty remaining in class for the full day. Child-motivated absenteeism occurs autonomously, by the volition of the child. This behavior is differentiated from non-child-motivated absences in which parents who withdraw children from school or keep them home, or circumstances such as homelessness.
